



Black Nite, Black Lite – Ballan Winter Solstice Festival

Description of project: (from Grant Application)

- Celebrating the Winter Solstice in Ballan imagine fluorescent window displays along the shopping strip with other arts features throughout the streetscape, that come to life after dark. The window décor would be fluorescent, and illuminated using UV lighting, making the streetscape vivid with colour.
- For this application, the proposal is to explore the potential for a mid-winter celebration in Ballan. Possible names for the event are 'Black Nite Black Light', or 'Ballan Winter Solstice Festival' or 'The Ballan Winter Feast'. Local artists (organised through Wombat) will be invited to take responsibility for decorating a shop window with fluorescent displays that come to life through UV / Black lighting after dark. The windows will appeal to all ages and entice the community to rug up and come out into the streetscape to view the windows.
- To achieve success, we believe it is necessary to build this event up over several years, hence this first year would be trialling the festival's potential. In doing this, we will be able to encourage and engage the support of larger community groups (such as Autumn Festival Committee, and Ballan Chamber of Commerce) to become part of the event. The festival has the potential to run for a week opening on a Saturday night with a soup kitchen and other food vans in the street. The following Saturday night (for the closing of the celebration) a medieval feast could take place in the Mechanics Hall, with a spit roast and other entertainment.


